turn to	to go to someone or something for help <i>Remember that you can always () your mother for help when you need it.</i>
tell on	to tell someone in power about the bad behavior of someone else <i>Christina always () bullies when she was in school.</i>
come down to	to depend on one important point <i>It all () if you want doves at your wedding or not.</i>
come off	to become separated from something <i>Her nail polish has gradually ().</i>
fix up	to repair or improve something <i>Jayden decided that he would () the old car for his father.</i>
inquire after	to ask for information about someone, especially about their health or what they are doing <i>Foster was () you at the meeting last night.</i>
hang around with	to spend a lot of time with someone <i>His mother was worried about the people he was ().</i>
put forth	to suggest something for people to think about <i>The ideas that you () in that last meeting were excellent.</i>
