hand out	to give something to other people <i>There was a young man () flyers in front of the bus stop.</i>
hold back	to stop yourself from doing something <i>During the meeting, Tessa () and didn't mention her own opinion.</i>
work out	to exercise in order to improve your health or physical fitness <i>Emily () at the gym four times per week.</i>
engage in	to take part in something <i>She just hoped that her son wasn't () any criminal activities.</i>
fall on	to happen on a specific day or date <i>The lunar eclipse just happened to () my birthday.</i>
come by	to visit someone <i>Why don't you () after work tomorrow.</i>
throw up	to have something from your stomach come out through your mouth <i>She had such a bad stomach ache that it caused her to ().</i>
lay out	to spread something out <i>Ursula () all her receipts on the table so she could organize them.</i>
put off	to decide to do something at a later time <i>Katherine () writing her report until the very last minute.</i>
get across	to communicate something clearly so that it can be understood <i>It took a while, but she finally () her point ().</i>
