push forward	to continue moving or traveling to a place, even when it is far or difficult to get to <i>Since there is only a few kilometers left, let's just () for a little longer.</i>
hold up	to continue to be strong and effective <i>This truck is () really well, considering that it's almost twenty years old.</i>
talk back to	to answer someone in a rude way <i>She taught all of her children that it was rude to () teachers.</i>
bring on	to make something bad happen <i>Running in the cold () an asthma attack.</i>
relate to	to be connected with someone or something <i>All emails () the next big marketing campaign should be sent to the section chief as well.</i>
go for	to go somewhere to get someone or something <i>Mom has just () some coffee.</i>
grow out of	to develop from something <i>That law () a need to protect children from dangerous lawn toys.</i>
report to	to be managed by someone at work and have to give information to them regularly <i>The Vice President of Sales () directly () the CEO.</i>
wind up	to be in a place or situation that was not expected, especially an unpleasant one <i>Dallas wasn't quite sure how he'd () on a rollercoaster.</i>
