besides

Besides being a great leader, she's also very skilled in negotiations.

The class was boring. **Besides**, the teacher didn't explain things clearly.

Besides harming wildlife, plastic pollution also affects human health.

idiom

Steal someone's thunder

Meaning: To take attention away from someone else's achievement.

Example: I was about to share my good news, but my sister **stole my thunder** by announcing her engagement.

I didn't mean to **steal your thunder**—I honestly didn't know you were planning to do the same thing.
