You'll be fine in Italy, **as long as** you keep your wallet safe and stay in well-lit areas.

We can finish this on time, **as long as** everyone sticks to the schedule.

idiom

Break a leg

Meaning: A way of wishing someone good luck, especially before a performance.

Example: "You're going to do great in the play tonight. **Break a leg!**"

Break a leg at your piano recital. I'll be cheering for you!
