Many cities are struggling with traffic problems. Tokyo is **a case in point**.
Online education can be very effective. **A case in point** is how quickly students adapted during the pandemic.
Some companies succeed by focusing on customer experience. Apple is **a case in point**.
Climate change is affecting ecosystems around the world. The melting of Arctic ice is **a case in point**.

I was trying to fix the car myself, but after hours of struggling, I **threw in the towel** and called a mechanic.
