Example: When healthy eating became popular, many people **jumped on the bandwagon**.

move on to

Let's finish this topic and **move on to** the next one.

After working as a designer for five years, she **moved on to** a management role.

Now that we've covered the basics, let's **move on to** more advanced techniques.

He took some time to recover from the breakup, but eventually he **moved on to** a new relationship.

We'll discuss the budget first, and then **move on to** scheduling.
