### **I suggest ~**

**A:** We only have one day in Kyoto.

**B: I suggest visiting** Kiyomizu Temple in the morning.

**A:** Why in the morning?

**B:** It's less crowded then.

### **My recommendation is that ~**

**A:** Sales have dropped this month, especially among younger customers.

**B: My recommendation is that** we focus on online marketing, particularly social media.

**A:** Do you mean increasing ads or changing our content?

**B:** Both. Short videos and influencer collaborations could be effective.

**A:** That might require extra budget.

**B:** True, but it should improve brand visibility and engagement in the long run.

### **I think you should ~**

**A:** I studied English for five hours, but I remember nothing.

**B: I think you should** take a break.

**A:** But the test is tomorrow!

**B:** Exactly—that brain needs sleep, not panic.

## **idiom**

### **pitch in**

Meaning: to help out, usually by contributing effort, time, or money—especially as part of a group.

Tone & nuance

- Casual and positive
- Often implies voluntary teamwork
- Not formal (you wouldn't usually use it in official reports)

Example: Everyone pitched in to clean up after the party.

We all pitched in to buy her a birthday gift.

## Lesson 93 :提案する④：控えめな提案

### suppose

A: Let's meet at 7 a.m.

B: I **suppose** that's okay...

A: You don't sound convinced.

B: I'm just not a morning person.

### What if ~

A: I don't know how to teach this topic.

B: **What if** we use a game?

A: That could make it fun.

B: And easier to understand.

### It's just an idea, but why don't we ~

A: We need to attract more customers.

B: **It's just an idea, but why don't we** offer a limited-time discount?

A: That could bring people in quickly.

B: Yes, especially new customers.

### It might be a good idea to ~

A: I'm late again.

B: **It might be a good idea to** stop trusting your alarm.

A: Hey, it tries its best.

B: Unlike you.
